
SPECIAL ADULT EVENTS

After 1848, when gold was discovered in California, dreams of adventure and instant wealth made westward movement the all-consuming passion of the nation. "Go West Young Man" became the catch phrase of the era, but joining these young men were

a hardy collection of women. Prostitutes and preacher's wives, escaped slaves and society women, reformers, teachers, saloon keepers, cross dressers, criminals...the women of the Gold Rush helped shape the region and

the nation. Yet their stories have been largely forgotten. Author Mary Volmer explores how the interplay of fiction and history allows for a reimagining of history's lost voices, and discusses how she transformed her research on early California's female residents into the critically acclaimed novel Crown of Dust.

birthday because she cannot bear to live among the rich. These passing strangers reveal the absurd lives of the wealthy.

November 2: <u>Stiff: The Curious Lives of Human Cadavers</u> by Mary Roach



An oddly compelling, often hilarious exploration of the strange lives of our bodies postmortem. For two thousand years, cadavers—some willingly, some unwittingly—have been involved in science's boldest strides and weirdest undertakings. In this fascinat-

ing, ennobling account, Roach tells the engrossing story of our bodies when we are no longer with them.

December 7: <u>Major Pettigrew's Last Stand</u> by Helen Simonson



Major Pettigrew epitomizes the Englishman with the "stiff upper lip," as he fights to retrieve a valuable family heirloom for tradition's sake. The embattled hero discovers an unexpected ally and source of consolation in his neighbor, the Pakistani shopkeeper Jasmina Ali. On the surface their backgrounds and life experiences couldn't

be more different, but they discover that they have the most important things in common.
