

Friday, June 24 @ 1:00 pm - The Gift of Age



BRANCH MANAGER'S NOTES

Hello. Friends-

At this time of the year, one of our more frequently questions* is about how our library will be impacted by the City's budget. Unfortunately, as I write these notes the answer is still "We don't know."

The Mayor's office is scheduled to present the City's budget to the Council by April 15th, then Council will vote on either adopting it in that form or making any changes. In past years, City Council has solicited input from the community in Town Hall Meetings; should they do so again we will post those dates. The City Council is expected to vote on the budget in June, so that it may be implemented when the new fiscal year begins in July.

Information about the City's budget and what it means for San Diego Public Library will likely be available on SD-PL's website (www.sandiegolibrary.org) and that of the San Diego Library Foundation (www.supportmylibrary.org). As we learn more, we will share that information with you.

In the meantime, I and our library's staff thank you all for your support. It is a pleasure to be able to work in PB – where the people are as kind as the scenery is beautiful.

* For anyone who was curious, the other most frequently asked questions in March & April are Do you carry tax forms? [Answer: CA tax booklets with forms are available at all SDPL libraries, but you'd need to either print the Federal forms from www.irs.gov or pick them up at the Central Library] and the perennially popular Where is the bathroom? ©


